As the cost of new drill pipe increases along with lead times, many are finding the need to pull old pipe out of the weeds and make it useable again. The rebuilding of tong spaces on a tool joint box or pin is quite similar to traditional hardbanding applications. Postalloy Tool Joint BU-MCG was designed to make the re-building process easy when done properly with our basic application requirements. Careful attention to preheating procedures and temperatures, as well as, slow cooling during post-welding procedures is critical. Particular attention should be given to inspection of services for cracks using MPI methods. Some adjustments will be required to accommodate various diameters of tool joints.

- Most reputable hardband wire suppliers will supply wire in a custom printed box with lot numbers clearly identified on spools and boxes.
- Be sure to check the spools because some of the hardbanding applicators have been known to supply lower grade wires in Duraband boxes.

Keeping a record
of work done on tool joints or
drilling components is not required by us,
but may be required by the pipe owner. We
do, however, HIGHLY recommend keeping good
records. A sample of an Application Log is
attached for your review. Serial number, condition
of the internal protective coating & existing
hardbanding, preheat & interpass temperatures,
wire lot number, tool joint O.D., finished
hardband O.D. should be recorded
at a minimum.
